MEET THE TEACHING & LEARNING HUB CO-DIRECTORS

In an effort to further our shared mission of fostering student success across the state, the Belk Center, Achieving the Dream (ATD) and the NC Student Success Center are leveraging our considerable technical expertise to support full and part-time faculty and staff educators from North Carolina community colleges in their efforts to build equity in learning and student success through Teaching and Learning Hubs. The collaborative work began in 2019 with Teaching and Learning case studies at six community colleges; the findings were used in the development of the Hubs.

Offering in-person, virtual, and hybrid workshops and seminars, the Teaching and Learning Hubs will help faculty learn about, adopt, test and scale the evidence-based strategies that have increased equitable student success outcomes across the nation. As highly engaged faculty, the Co-Directors in these first two Hubs will play a critical role in shaping the Hub's content by providing insight from affiliate colleges' faculty. Support from the System Office and their college provides 50% release time for each Co-Director.

East Hub:
