Each year, the **DREAM** conference is a full circle moment for our <u>fellows</u> <u>program</u>, which was launched in 2017 through a partnership with ATD. It brings together doctoral students to engage in national conversations around community colleges and student success.

Four of our Belk Center Fellows joined us this year, gaining **invaluable opportunities** to exchange ideas and explore strategies that can drive meaningful change in support of faculty and student success across the nation.



We were also excited to have several Belk Center colleagues **lead packed-room sessions** on critical topics, providing community college executive leadership with evidence-based insights to support students and their communities.



Sarah Deal and Monique Colclough joined Kristi Short of Central Carolina Community College and Brice Melton of Catawba Valley Community College to discuss how Teaching & Learning Hubs are enhancing capacity and establishing a robust support system.

Holley Nichols and Sarah Deal presented initial findings from our Ascendium-funded rural college research, followed by a discussion with Margaret Annunziata of Isothermal Community College, John Enamait of Stanly Community College, and Brice Melton of Catawba Valley Community College on takeaways.



Leaders who participated in **Rural College Leadership Program** also shared examples of how they improved student outcomes in their communities through innovative changes such as the **'Be Great in 8'** condensed course term and **contextualizing required English courses** to align with students' program interests.

Each example shared at DREAM highlighted the power of **leveraging data to inform change**, **creative and consistent communication** throughout implementation and **planned support structures** for faculty and staff.
